Substance Abuse Prevention

This fact sheet provides county level data on substance use and related factors to help guide decisions about prevention efforts. These data can be used to justify need for prevention funding, monitor substance-related trends, and plan programs and initiatives by establishing community level prevention priorities.

According to 2016 estimates from the U.S. Census Bureau, Traverse County has 3,356 residents; 20% are under the age of 18.

Adult Substance Use

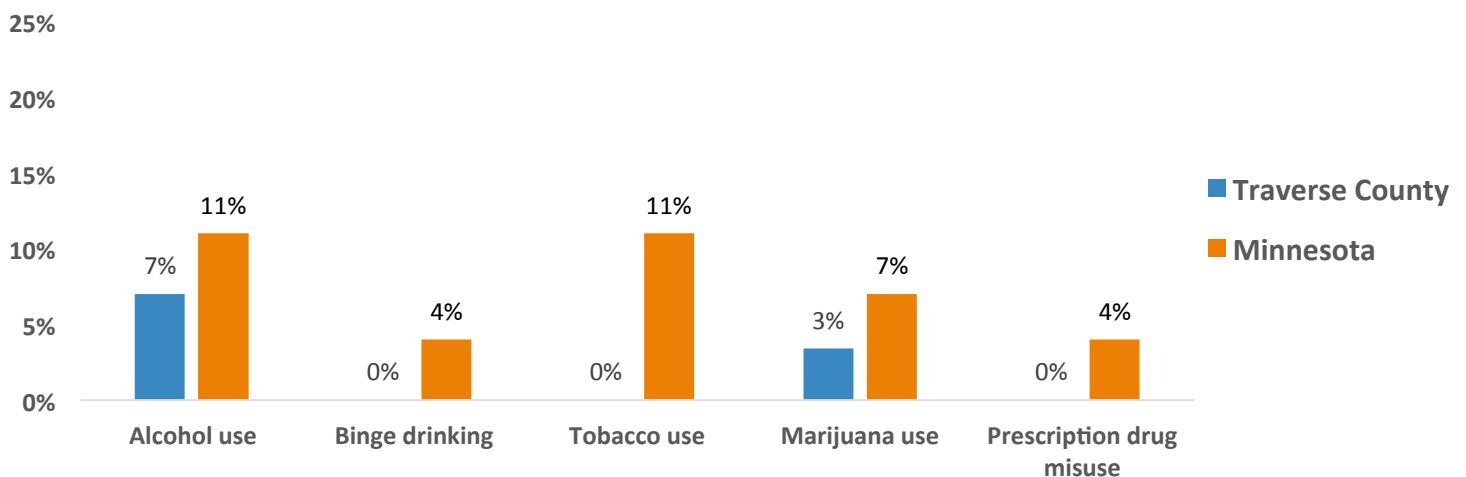
According to the 2015 Minnesota Survey on Adult Substance Use (MNSASU):

- Past-month binge drinking (women having 4+ drinks or men having 5+ drinks in a row on one occasion) was reported by 11% of adults in the Southwest region and 14% of Minnesota adults.
- Past-month cigarette smoking was reported by 16% of Southwest adults and 16% of Minnesota adults.
- Past-month marijuana use was reported by 2% of adults in the Southwest region compared to 5% of adults statewide.

Youth Substance Use

Data on youth substance use are from the Minnesota Student Survey (MSS). Data are limited when a county doesn't have more than one participating district per grade. Alcohol

Past 30-day alcohol use was reported by 7% of 9th graders, and 48% of 11th graders in Traverse County in 2016. Use among 9th graders dropped in Traverse County from 58% in 1998 to 7% in 2016. Past 30-day binge drinking (defined as having five or more drinks in a row on one occasion) was reported by 0% of 9th graders, and 21% of 11th graders in 2016.

Tobacco/Nicotine

Of Traverse County 9th and 11th graders, 0% and 14% reported any past 30-day tobacco use, respectively: 0% and 7% reported smoking cigarettes; no students reported smoking cigars or cigarillos, in either grade; and 0% and 11% reported chewing tobacco use, respectively. In addition, 0% and 7% of 9th and 11th graders reported e-cigarette use, respectively, and 0% and 4% reported hookah use; questions about these two methods of nicotine use were added to the survey in 2016. Cigarette smoking among 9th graders dropped in Traverse County from 11% in 1998 to 0% in 2016.

Other Drugs

Past 30-day marijuana use was reported by 3% of 9th graders, and 17% of 11th graders in Traverse County in 2016. Use among 9th graders was at 3% in both 1998 and in 2016.

No past 30-day prescription drug misuse was reported by 9th or 11th graders in Traverse County in 2016. However, in the past year, students in 11th grade reported the misuse of stimulants (4%); ADD or ADHD medication (7%); and tranquilizers (7%).

Consequences

Alcohol

- The DWI arrest rate for Traverse County residents was 38.2 per 10,000 population in 2015, with an average of 47.1 from 2006 to 2015. The state's average was 57.0 (Minnesota Office of Traffic Safety, DPS)
- In 2015, 2.9% of motor vehicle crashes in Traverse County were alcohol-related, compared to 4.7% throughout the state (*Crash Facts*, DPS)

Tobacco

- The lung, bronchus and trachea cancer death rate for Traverse County has averaged 6.5 per 10,000 population from 2006 to 2015. That's higher than the state average of 4.5 (Minnesota Center for Health Statistics, MDH)

Drugs

- From 2000 to 2015, there were 2 opioid deaths (non-exclusive) in Traverse County, of 2,273 total in Minnesota. Over that same 15-year period, there were no heroin deaths in Traverse County; there were 453 in the state as a whole (Minnesota Center for Health Statistics, MDH)
